Partnership for Prescription Assistance

Connection to Care Program - www.pfizerhelpfulanswers.com

Connection to Care offers many Pfizer branded medicines shipped t o the health care provider's office for free. To qualify patients must: have no prescription coverage or qualify for a hardship exception, meet the household income guidelines and live in the United States, Puerto Rico, or the US Virgin Islands.

Bridges to Access - www.bridgestoaccess.com

Bridges to Access offers many Glaxo Smith Kline branded medicines for free. To qualify patients must meet the household income and eligibility guidelines. Note: Patients will have to have an advocate within the health care provider's office to complete the application.

Together Rx Access - <u>www.togetherrxaccess.com</u>

The Together Rx Access® Card offers patients savings of 25 to 40 percent on brand-name prescription medicines and products. To qualify patients must meet eligibility requirements. Together Rx Access is accepted at many pharmacies.
